ARTICLE 15 Qualifications for Elders

Titus 1:6-9

⁶ If any be blameless, the husband of one wife, having faithful children not accused of riot or unruly. ⁷ For a bishop must be blameless, as the steward of God; not self-willed, not soon angry, not given to wine, no striker, not given to filthy lucre; ⁸ But a lover of hospitality, a lover of good men, sober, just, holy, temperate; ⁹ Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers.

1 Peter 5:1-5

¹The elders which are among you I exhort, who am also an elder, and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, and also a partaker of the glory that shall be revealed: ²Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking the oversight thereof, not by constraint, but willingly; not for filthy lucre, but of a ready mind; ³Neither as being lords over God's heritage, but being examples to the flock. ⁴And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away. ⁵Likewise, ye younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea, all of you be subject one to another, and be clothed with humility: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble. [See also: 1 Tim 3:1-7; Acts 20:28]

Article 16 Qualifications for Deacons & Deaconesses

1 Tim 3:8-13

⁸ Likewise must the deacons be grave, not double-tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy of filthy lucre; ⁹ Holding the mystery of the faith in a pure conscience. ¹⁰ And let these also first be proved; then let them use the office of a deacon, being found blameless. ¹¹ Even so must their wives be grave, not slanderers, sober, faithful in all things. ¹² Let the deacons be the husbands of one wife, ruling their children and their own houses well. ¹³ For they that have used the office of a deacon well purchase to themselves a good degree, and great boldness in the faith which is in Christ Jesus. *|See also: Acts 6:1-6, Titus 1:7|*

Work As Worship

Rev David Cher, Lord's Day, 9 June 2024

eloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.
When our work gets tough and heavygoing, we are tempted to think that work is a curse, bringing drudgery and dread into our lives. However, we would do well in reminding ourselves that work is God's gift to us. God first gave Adam the responsibility of his work of tending the Garden of Eden (Gen. 2:15 "And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it"). It is only after the Fall that work became hard and difficult (Gen. 3:17-19).

Even we as followers of Christ seem to follow the way of the world in viewing our work with negative attitudes of cynicism and mediocrity and just getting by with it. As God-called people, we are surely reminded that we are to do our work to the best of our gifts, talents, and abilities regardless of our work circumstances (Col .3:23-24 "And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ"). Indeed, work is one of our public spheres of action and influence through which our relationship with God should come into view and not slide into insignificance and be overshadowed by workplace busyness, politics, and grey areas of compromise.

God's call in our work does not mean that our work does not include periods of setbacks and discouragement. What is certainly important and critical is how we do not remain in that low state but can raise ourselves amid our tiredness and weariness (Isaiah 40:30-31 "Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall: But they that

wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint"). God would enable us to not only press on but also be in an energised state in doing so. As spiritual giants such as Elijah and modern examples like David Livingstone and Charles Spurgeon struggled to the point of periods of discouragement and depression, we can be encouraged that they in the end persevered and flourished in their work for God.

Finally, we are called of Christ (Rom. 1:6-7) and not merely called to our work. This sure and basic foundation of our identity in Christ should give us the prime motivation and encouragements to manifest or show forth Christ in everything that we do in our lives. Let us make the best use of every opportunity that God has given us in our daily work routine and in our relations with our colleagues and people around us. Let us also be sensitive and obedient to God and His leading, to be faithful in our different seasons and callings throughout the whole of our lives (Prov. 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths").

Thank you for all your prayers for the South Vietnam Team as we served and ministered to the 100 children who came for the Children's Camp. Continue to pray for our safety and protection as we make our way back home to Singapore.
