

# Serve Joyfully!

Rev David Cher, Lord's Day, 10 November 2024

eloved Brethren,
Greetings in the Precious Name of
our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We
are drawing close to the end of this year
and before we know it, it will be upon us! How has
the year been for you? Have you managed to fuffli
land complete your resolutions and goals from
the start of this year? How has the LORD
changed your direction and perspective during
this year?

Romans 12:1 "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service" surely reminds us that the whole of our lives, whether in church or our families and society, are to be lived out in our spiritual service for the LORD. In addition, both Romans 12:11 and Psalm 100:2 remind us to serve the LORD with gladness and enthusiasm. What this implies and means for us is that our spiritual serving would not be always smooth and easygoing, and thus involve possible hardships and difficulties. We would then be tempted to fall into the drudgery of our duties and responsibilities and lose the joy of our serving.

As followers of Christ, every one of us is given different and specific spiritual gifts and talents to serve especially in the Body of Christ, right here in Galilee Church. However, we need to put into action and exercise the spiritual gifts and talents that we are given. Otherwise, they would fall into disuse and lethargy. When we are serving, do we think more about ourselves than others, what we can gain or benefit for ourselves rather than how others are growing and benefiting from our service? This would hinder and discourage when we do not see the fruits of our labour and

experience the positive feelings of personal fulfillment and enjoyment that comes with it. A good reminder in such a situation is the Lord's word in Acts 20:35 that it is indeed better to give than to receive (Acts 20:35).

This would bring us to the motivation and goal of our serving, and the different thoughts and actions that go into it. The constant question and reminder that we must ask ourselves is "Who do you work or labour for?" Ultimately, we are working or serving the LORD. What does this mean for each of us? This should mean that our serving must be aligned with God and His kingdom priorities and not any other (Matt. 6:33). Also, no matter how gifted and talented we are, we are reminded not to place our sole and complete dependence on them, but to find our joy and strength from God during the different seasons of our serving (Neh. 8:10).

When we are working for the LORD, we can find ourselves joyfully and contentedly pressing on in it, knowing that our work for Him is never aimless and meaningless (1 Cor. 15:58 "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord'). Our contribution and part in the Kingdom's Work may be yet unseen but will be lasting and acknowledged by God Himself (Matt. 25:21, 23).

Let us see and realise that our serving is part of our sanctification process and our needed transformation into the image and nature of Christ. In so doing, may this proper perspective of serving enable us to grow and mature in our walk with God. God bless!
