Serve While We Can!

Pastor Simon, Lord's Day, 17 November 2024

Brethren,
Greetings in the Name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ! A church Elder, a seasoned traveller, recounted how he hung on for dear life in a plane caught in a violent thunderstorm, after the pilot's two failed attempts to land at Changi International Airport. Thank God, the pilot finally succeeded at the third attempt. Can you imagine the myriad of thoughts that raced through the Elder's mind and the numerous "prayer calls" he made to God during that horrendous short span of time when the plane tried in vain to land?

In my experience, when air turbulence hits the plane, I grip hard the seat handles and fearful uneasiness, and wild imaginations permeate in my mind. Thankfully a short while later, the plane resumes back to normal. However, we all know that things can go awfully wrong. The Bible says, "Whereas ye know not what shall be on the morrow" James 4:14. Tragedies, natural disasters, fanatical atrocities and political calamities hit the world again and again. Human lives are lost constantly and instantly. Our times are in God's hands. For what is your life? It is even a vapour that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away" (James 4:14). There is nothing we can do to "fix" the dangers and uncertainties of life! It is not possible to create a permanent haven of peace and security in this fallen world.

Such conditions remind us to "take stock" of our lives, to reflect and evaluate prayerfully how we are living for Christ whilst we have the breath of life. Have we been keeping close to God? Have we been faithful and diligent in serving our Lord this year? Are we contributing to the well-being of the church? Have the things of the world distracted us from God's calling? If the Lord call us home today, are we ready? Will we receive His commendation— "Well done, good and faithful servant... (Matt 25:23b)?

The story was told of a young man who was breathing his last. He had been a Christian for only a month. Though thankful to the Lord for granting him the gift of salvation in his final days on earth, he was nonetheless grieved that he had no opportunity to serve the Lord, nor to share the Gospel of God's saving grace with others. He explained, "I am not afraid to die; Jesus has saved me. But must I go empty-handed to the Lord?" Upon hearing this account, Charles C. Luther was touched to write this beautiful hymn:

"Must I go, and empty-handed,
thus my dear Redeemer meet?
Not one day of service give Him,
Lay no trophy at His feet?"

The lyrics penned in 1886 speak to our hearts even today. It is in our culture that when we go visiting, we do not go empty-handed but bring a gift out of love and respect. Imagine, how awkward it would be to go empty-handed before the Lord? Brethren, we pray that none of us, not one of us Galileans, should ever go before our Saviour empty-handed on that day! Let's serve TOGETHER!
